



What is ARCHWAY?



Archway is designed for Royal Arch Chapters to help shape their future, grow their membership and enhance their member's experience. It is based on extensive research of what our members want—and what works well in successful, thriving Chapters across our Constitution.

Many of the challenges that Chapters face are different to Lodges. Archway is therefore not a simple translation of the Members' Pathway into the Royal Arch, and so has been developed separately. However, some of the challenges are similar. References to resources within the Members' Pathway and Solomon are therefore provided where relevant.

Archway aims to help Chapters become more vibrant and more enjoyable, so that every Companion looks forward to their next meeting with enthusiasm. Resources to enhance understanding of the Royal Arch are also provided along with advice for attracting new members, and for supporting every member of the Chapter.

It is intended to be an evolving resource with more examples and case studies of good practice added over time. There is no one size fits all solution, but the resources and options it offers highlight what is possible to achieve if Chapters wish to embrace change and secure their future.



UGLE Strategy and The Royal Arch



Both UGLE and Supreme Grand Chapter function in many areas as one organisation with a shared leadership and common values—the new UGLE **Strategy for Freemasonry** is therefore an integrated one that reinforces the fundamental connection between the Royal Arch and the Craft.

Participation in the Royal Arch provides a new dimension to our members' experience and a more complete understanding of what it means to be a Freemason in the United Grand Lodge of England. It is an established fact that those who progress into the Royal Arch are far more likely to remain engaged with Freemasonry in general than those who limit their experience of what *Pure Antient Masonry* has to offer.

The success of the Royal Arch is therefore directly related to the success of our Lodges. A clear and shared understanding of this will ensure that our actions can contribute over time to a stronger, more secure future for Freemasonry in the 21st Century and beyond.



Strategy at the Chapter Level

The practical advice offered in Archway directly addresses the main challenges our Chapters face. But to achieve the desired results, many Chapters need to be prepared to make changes where necessary—to try something new—or to stop doing something if it isn't working for your Chapter.

We are rightly proud of our traditions, but as the years pass, these 'traditions' often accumulate, and some become outdated or unhelpful.

A key aspect to success of the Strategy is adoption of a different mindset— a **YES IF** approach, not **No Because...**

When something new is proposed, be prepared to say **YES** we can achieve these goals **IF** we change this or that, rather than say no because we have always done it 'our way'.

You will then be able to face the future with renewed enthusiasm and measure your success in terms of increased member satisfaction, and a return to a more secure future.






How is ARCHWAY structured?

WHERE TO START and who should become INVOLVED?




Every member of the Chapter, from the newest to the most experienced, should have the opportunity to both explore and contribute to the use of Archway.

To assess the challenges and opportunities the Chapter can exploit, a suitable starting point might be the use of the review tool that is contained in the **SHAPE** stone.

Also, within **GROW** a focus is placed on a survey of member satisfaction with your chapter to ensure that an environment can be created for growth.


Either approach will provide information that might help your Chapter to focus its initial use of Archway in one direction rather than another.

Please note that many of the resources within Archway highlight the responsibilities of the 'roles' needed within a Chapter rather than specifying the formal Officer who should carry them out.

SHAPE

Building on the past, looking to the future

- Use a review tool to understand your Chapter and its challenges
- Create a structure to oversee your Chapter's wellbeing
- Develop a succession and progression plan
- Identify members with the personal skills to help with your plan

GROW

Helping more people to continue their journey

- Create an environment that will attract and retain members
- Use digital media to promote your chapter, and connect with feeder Lodges
- Empower your members to communicate with potential candidates
- Maintain contact with 'missing' and unattached RA Masons

WHERE TO START THE REVIEW TOOL



Each set of resources are grouped under the last of three columns each of which ask:

1: What do we want (Aims)

2: How do we get there (Steps)

3: What do we use (Resources)


We recommend you start with the review tool under SHAPE




This resource provides a review tool that will help you understand your chapter, identify the challenges it faces and start creating a plan.

- Structure the content of meetings including alternatives to exaltation ceremonies
- Organise enjoyable and efficient Festive Boards
- Promote visiting amongst Chapters
